The approach being drawn up at the SMI will also play a key role in further scientific and practical research at the new center.

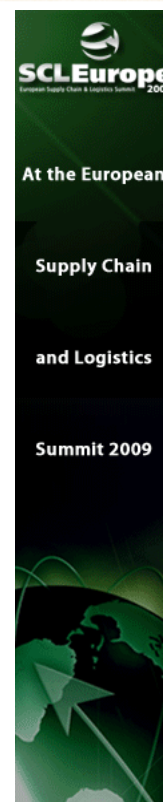
